Central Sanskrit University, Delhi is one of the reputed universities in India known for imparting high quality education. This University is also works as the Nodal Agency of Govt. of India for carrying out all its activities related to the Sanskrit language. Purpose of the Academic & Administrative Audit:

The purpose of the Academic & Administrative Audit is to evaluate the performance of the university departments and other academic units to appreciate their achievements and give suggestions for further improvement of the quality of teaching, research, administration, curricular and extra-curricular activities. After visiting the departments and academic centers, interacting with the HODs/Directors/Coordinators, teaching and non-teaching faculties, students and validating the data the committee would give valuable suggestions on the following points.

- 1. Availability of teaching and non-teaching faculty.
- 2. Infrastructural facilities available for carrying out academic activities.
- 3. Efforts taken for curricular development.

- 4. Teacher quality.
- 5. Teaching methods adopted and use of ICT in teaching-learning process.
- 6. Feedback mechanism used for assessing the performance of teachers by students and for curricular development.
- 7. Faculty development programmes implemented by the department.
- 8. Strengths, Weaknesses. Opportunities and Challenges of the department.
- 9. Research facilities and research output in the form of publications.
- 10. Computer, internet and library facilities available.
- 11. Mentoring system, introduction of Remedial classes, Bridge courses, guidance for NET/SET and competitive examinations.
- 12. Skill development and personality development programmes.
- 13. Generation of funds and optimum utilization.
- 14. Evaluation methods adopted for internal and external examinations.
- 15. Future plans of the department.

Methodology:

The departments and other academic centers are expected to submit the necessary information in the Format provided by the IQAC of the University. The information provided should include all the aspects as per NAAC criteria. The information should also include the achievements, curricular, co-curricular activities and extra-curricular activities carried out, participation of students in various activities and their achievements and participation of teachers in national and international conferences, seminars and workshops. The funds the department, the purpose and the names of the funding agencies and duration of the project should be indicated. Individual faculty profile indicating their contribution in teaching, research and extension activities and their achievements, awards and prizes received along with supporting data should also be kept ready.

The Campuses and Departments should keep all the data such as Feedback forms collected from students and other stakeholders on curricular developments, infrastructural facilities and performance of teachers for validation of the committee. The information about consultancy services, collaborations with other reputed universities and institutions, placement records, students admitted and their results in final examinations, mentoring system and financial support provided to students etc. should also be kept ready during the visit of Academic & Administrative Audit Committee visit.

Visit of Academic & Administrative Audit Peer Team:

The Academic & Administrative Audit committee will visit the academic & administrative units of the University as per the visit schedule. During the visit to the Campuses and Departments, the Director and HODs will make a brief presentation about the department on all aspects to the Academic & Administrative Audit committee. The committee, then, will interact with teaching and non-teaching staff see the facilities available for teaching and research and also the computer and internet facilities and departmental library facility. The faculties can interact with the committee and brief them about the innovative methods adopted in teaching and research and efforts taken for improving the quality. The faculty can also impress upon how their department is different than similar departments in other universities. The committee will also interact with the students to have suggestions from them regarding infrastructural facilities available, performance of teachers, evaluation methods adopted and teaching learning process.

It is expected that all the departments and other academic centers fulfill the information in the format for providing Campus & Departmental information enclosed herewith and submit to the Academic & Administrative Audit Committee on its arrival.

Academic and Administrative Audit (AAA) A brief advisory note

Context:

The National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) has evolved tools and guidelines for improving quality for different levels of Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) and for its sustenance. By establishing Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) and undergoing External Quality Assurance process it's possible to continuously strive for excellence.

The monitoring and evaluation of the institutional processes require a carefully structured system of internal and external review. The NAAC expects the Institutions to undertake continuous Academic and Administrative Audits (AAA). This brief note is intended to serve as advisory to all accredited HEIs who volunteer to undertake AAA.

About Academic and Administrative Audit (AAA):

Academic and Administrative Audit (AAA), are very essential for the excellence in Higher Education. These are interrelated concepts. Thus in order to have a quality oriented academic, there should be a strong administrative background.

Academic Audit: - Academic audit can be understood as a scientific and systematic method of reviewing the quality of academic process in the institution. It is related with the quality assurance and enhancing the quality of academic activities in HEIs.

Administrative Audit: - It can be defined as a process of evaluating the efficiency and effectiveness of the administrative procedure. It includes assessment of policies, strategies & functions of the various administrative departments, control of the overall administrative system etc.

Major objectives of AAA:

- 1. To understand the existing system and assess the strengths and weaknesses of the Departments and Administrative Units and to suggest the methods for improvement and for overcoming the weaknesses.
- 2. To identify the bottlenecks in the existing administrative mechanisms and to identify the opportunities for academic reforms, administrative reforms and examination reforms etc.
- 3. To evaluate the optimum utilization of financial and other resources.
- 4. To suggest the methods for continuous improvement of quality keeping in mind criteria and reports by NAAC and other bodies.

Approach towards AAA: - World class Universities or institutions of eminence cannot be built overnight or legislated into existence. For that strict and continuous Audit of Academic and Administrative process should be adopted. Both the AAA can be done internally and externally. Internally it should be done by the IQAC of the institutions, while externally it can be done by the University (for Colleges) or by other peers. In some states it is organised by state level agencies. Knowledge Consortium of Gujarat (KCG) has developed a very good model of AAA in state of Gujarat. It is also learnt that many of the HEIs volunteering for third and fourth cycles of accreditation have done AAA.

<u>Methodology:</u>

NAAC has not prescribed any specific methodology or guidelines for conducting AAA. It is expected that each HEI may evolve its own guidelines and methodology by learning from good practices followed by leading institutions within and outside India. The successful practices can be adapted to suit specific context and requirement of HEI on various aspects such as given below:

➤ Criteria: IQAC of HEIs can decide set of criteria to be used for AAA. Some HEIs follow NAAC criteria as it compliments periodic assessment and accreditation by NAAC. Some HEIs have developed slightly different set of criteria. It is also learnt that some HEIs have taken NAAC departmental evaluation format and have done department-wise also.

- ➤ Periodicity: Some HEIs undertake the AAA exercise on annual basis. However many HEIs prefer to do this exercise once in three years or five years. An internal excersice every year and involvement of external peers once in a three or five years could be a good option.
- ➤ Selection of peers/experts: Since peer review is backbone of AAA, similar to accreditation by NAAC, it is important to select good experts as peers for AAA. Even though no specific qualifications can be prescribed for good peers, it is vital that peers should be able to command respect from faculty on the basis of their credentials such as academic distinctions, experience as reviewer on NAAC or similar bodies and professionalism.
- ➤ Process: HEIs can device its own process including self-evaluation by faculty and administrative units, schedule of onsite visit, format of report and outcome etc... Many HEIs try to follow NAAC's process and formats with some changes.
- ➤ Outcome: The outcome of AAA may be placed before Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) and Governing Bodies (GB) of the HEIs. Planof action can be prepared to implement the suggestions accepted by IQAC and GB.

It is important that HEIs should formally prepare the guidelines / statues / ordinances for AAA, so that it becomes an institutionalised practice. As the facilitator of quality culture in higher education, the NAAC will be taking efforts to promote any good practices of AAA brought to its attention. At present, NAAC has sponsored a good number of seminars across the country on the theme of AAA. The HEIs are advised to take benefit from deliberation of these seminars to update recent trends in AAA as tool for continuous quality improvement.

II. ACADEMIC DETAILS

1. Objectives & Goals set by the Campus

a. Introduction of the Campus

Jaipur Campus of Central Sanskrit University is dedicated to Sanskrit teaching, research and training in Sanskrit Education. It is a premier Sanskrit institution not only among all the campuses under Central Sanskrit University, New Delhi, but also in whole of Rajasthan.

Jaipur Campus offers five programmes of studies, namely Shastri, Shikshashastri, Acharya, Shikshaacharya & Vidyavairdhi & along with diploma Yoga and Ayurveda Sahitya two advance certificate courses. There are nine departments — Sahitya, Vyakarana, Jyotisha, Dharmashastra, Jain Darshan, Shikshashastra, Sarvadarshan, Veda & Modern Subjects. Campus has been following five modern subjects as introduced by the university, such as Physical Education, Hindi Literature, English literature, Political Science and Computer Science of which Hindi/English Literature and Political Science are to be chosen in the Modern Optional Paper at UG level. To upgrade traditional students with mainstream, a few new emerging subjects have also been incorporated in some of the courses at degree level. These subjects are — Computer Science, Environmental studies, Sociology, political science, English, Hindi, Value education, Yoga education, Human rights, Educational Technology, Educational Psychology etc. At present, the campus has 57 members of teaching staff out of which 34 are permanent and 21 are on Contract/Guest. Among the permanent faculty, there are 19 Professors, 02 Associate Professor

and 13 Assistant Professors. Among the entire faculty, total 14 teachers are female. All Faculties on contract basis have been selected as per UGC norms.

Jaipur campus is seriously engaged to translate the vision and mission of its university into reality. Besides, it has also taken a step forward to highlight and preserve Rajasthan's rich Sanskrit heritage. It is well known that Rajasthan is called second Kashi due to excellent scholarly pursuits by many Sanskrit Scholars. In addition to teaching, training and research activities, Campus has initiated projects and organized various seminars, workshops etc. in this regard.

Campus reserves top priority to undertake in-depth studies into the traditional Sanskrit knowledge systems. Our campus is the preferred destination for Sanskrit Education in Rajasthan. It is, even, attracting students from other parts of the country. In session 2020-21 year 1009 students took admission in above-mentioned programmes of studies. Additionally, Campus also runs diploma courses in Yoga with Ayurveda, Journalism in Sanskrit. Jainism. Prakrit literature is also abundant in this state hence Prakrit introductory & Pali introductory courses are under the distance education programs. Apart from that self-finance courses in Jyotish & Vastu are also conducted. If we add the strength of research scholars and students of certificate courses etc., the full strength of the campus touches the figure of 1000 which is rarely seen in traditional Sanskrit Institutions all over India. Many alumni of our campus have got best placements in state as well as central services. It is proud to say that many principals of various Govt. Sanskrit schools and Colleges of Rajasthan are from our Campus. Our students have also excelled in Rajasthan Administrative Service Exams as well as UPSC exams.

Admissions are done on entrance test base and it is completely transparent giving due weightage and consideration to the disadvantaged and physically challenged as per the Govt. norms. Campus caters to the diverse needs of the students in their studies so that every student should achieve his goal smoothly. Our teachers assess informally the pre-knowledge of the admitted students for indentifying areas of special attention. 15days/One month bridge courses are specially designed to enhance spoken skills, expression and creativity. Advanced students are given exposure towards elocution, effective communications and also encouraging them to write in University journals. Evaluation through Monthly and Semester wise exams is performed. University has introduced semester system in UG and PG courses which has resulted in the enhancement of knowledge of the students and a significant increase in admission.

Campus uses modern teaching aids while imparting education, like –Smart Class, Projector, Audio-visual Aids, and Computers etc. It has well-equipped labs for Educational Technology, Computer, Educational Psychology and Jyotisha. Vagvardhini Parishads are working effectively in all departments. Students are taking part with great interest and enthusiasm in all Parishads. Sincere efforts of our faculty and our students have always excelled well position in all the major Sanskrit competitions all over India. Our Campus always stood first or second

position whenever the youth festival took place. Our students have displayed their supremacy in all the different areas such as, Academic, Sports, and Cultural activities.

Campus has well-qualified teaching faculty as per UGC and NCTE norms in each department. Apart from classroom teaching through lecture method, our teachers invented many audio-visuals programs to supplement the teaching which are provided to the students through CDs/DVDs in addition to telecasting of various programs through Gyan Darshan Channel.

Campus has taken measures to promote research activities not only among the students but also faculty members by organizing extension lectures, E-Textualization project works and editing work etc. At present 130 students are registered for Vidyavaridhi (PhD). Contingency worth Rs. 10,000 per year and worth Rs. 8,000/-Scholarship P.M. is provided for meritorious scholars. 06 JRF and 09SRF are also engaged in research work presently. Our faculty member regularly participates in seminars/Symposia/Workshops etc. It has also contributed in good number of publications of books and research papers.

Our campus library has 32170 books. Every year, on an average an amount worth of Rs. 1, 50,000/- per year is spent for new arrivals. It is open to all working days. Research scholars and teacher trainees have open access to the books. The digitalization of library is in under process.

Campus has its own separate hostel for boys as well as girls with a total capacity of more than 200 seats. Hostels have the facilities of Reading room, Recreation, Mess, Gymnasium, Aquaguards, Geysers, Indoor games and round the clock security. Numbers of committees have been constituted for effective administration in the campus under the valuable guidance of principal.

Campus is fully aware that it is necessary to combine the traditional knowledge along with modern techniques. The relevance of ancient wisdom is to be preserved so as to make our nation socially and culturally strong. Therefore Campus organizes many special lectures in respected fields like Human Rights, Right to Education and Right to Information etc. Special camps such as Yoga, Blood Donation, Community awareness, plantation, cleanliness are also organized time to time through NSS.

Collective wisdom of employees and stakeholders has led Jaipur Campus to such heights that it has become a symbol of excellence in Sanskrit studies in whole of Rajasthan.

b. Objectives and Background

Rajasthan has a glorious past in Sanskrit Education. All its erstwhile kingdoms of Rajasthan had great respect for Indian ancient Heritage and Sanskrit scholars from different parts of India were honored and granted royal patronage. Erstwhile Jaipur kingdom has always given patronage for Sanskrit learning. Several renowned scholars of the time were invited to stay and lead the tradition of ancient Indian wisdom. Astronomical

observatories built by Raja Jai Singh of Jaipur are world famous. Jaipur got prominence in Sanskrit learning.

On the special request of chief minister late shri Shivnarayan mathur, Padamshree, Dr. Mandan Mishra- former Director, Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan New Delhi and first Director Prof.Ramkaran Sharma "Kendriya Sanskrit Vidhvapith" was found on 13th may 1983.it was possible only with their efforts and positive endeavors. it was known as Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, Deemed University situated in Jaipur. It is a matter of pleasure that Ministry of Law and Justice, Govt. of India published Central Sanskrit Universities Act, 2020 No. t of 2020 in the gazette of India on 15th March, 2020 as enacted by the Parliament and assented to by the President of India, By this Act Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan (Deemed to be University) has interalia been declared the Central Sanskrit University. In pursuance thereof, The Ministry of Human Resource Development Department of Higher Education Government of India wide notification dated 17th April 2020 published in official gadget has appointed the 30th days of April 2020 as the date on which the provisions of the Central Sanskrit Universities act 2020 shall come into force as such Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan Deemed to be university shall start functioning as the Central Sanskrit University under the above said act with effect from 30th April 2020. Presently Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan Jaipur Campus known as Central Sanskrit University Jaipur campus.

The campus has acquired a piece of land measuring 7.27 acres from Jaipur Development Authority at Triveni Nagar, Gopalpura by pass, Jaipur, at a distance of about 12 K.M. from Jaipur Railway Station, on which the buildings measuring about 8188 sq. mts. were constructed. Apart from the main building, this campus also has Boys' Hostel (58 rooms), Girls' Hostel (19 rooms) and also 9 units of Staff Quarters and an Auditorium. The campus offers research programme leading to the degree of Vidyavaridhi (Ph.D.).Centre for Prakrit studies & research centre has started functioning in this Campus since 2009.
